

## Do Children Get Overdue Charges?

Children's books borrowed on a child's library card do not receive a daily overdue charge like adults' books. However, there is usually an administration fee (currently £3) when the book is overdue by 6 weeks. This also happens when older children take out adult books on a children's library card.

## Accelerated Reading Scheme

We know that many of the local primary schools are using the Accelerated Reading Scheme so we've started labelling our Junior Fiction books with their ATOS level on the back.

There is a list of books in each level which you can access. This is an ongoing task so not all books have been labelled.

We don't want to restrict children to books on the AR scheme, but we thought this could be useful for parents and children and so would be interested in your feedback on this.

## Winter Reading Challenge
