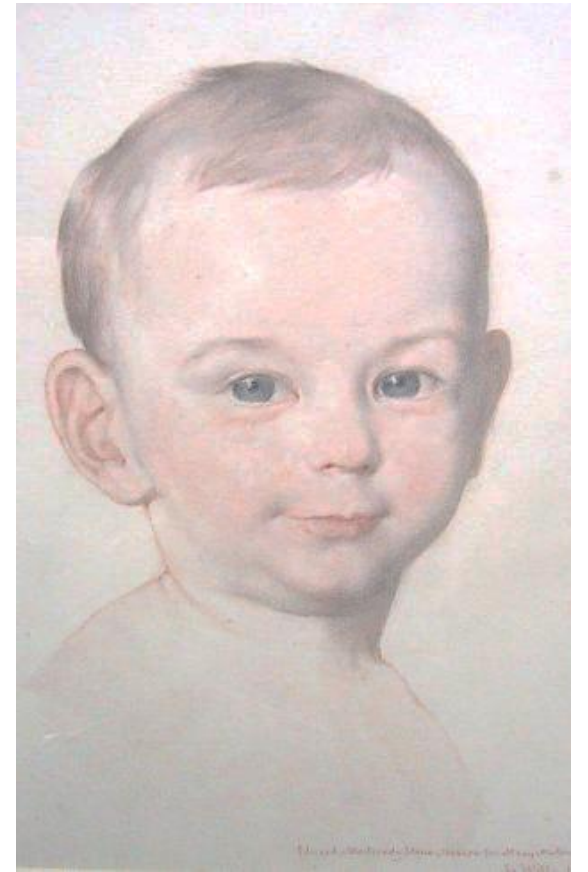

# William Mulready early life and career



1786 Born in County Clare, Ireland

1800 aged 14. Student at Royal College of Art London

1802 aged 17 married Elizabeth Varley and had 3 sons by age 21

1806 won the RA silver medal for drawing.

1815 elected as Associate of Royal Academy

1816 Elected as a full member of the RA

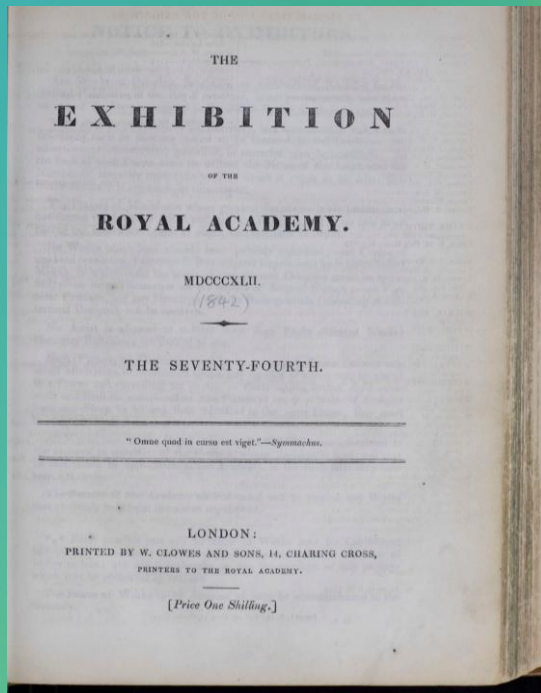

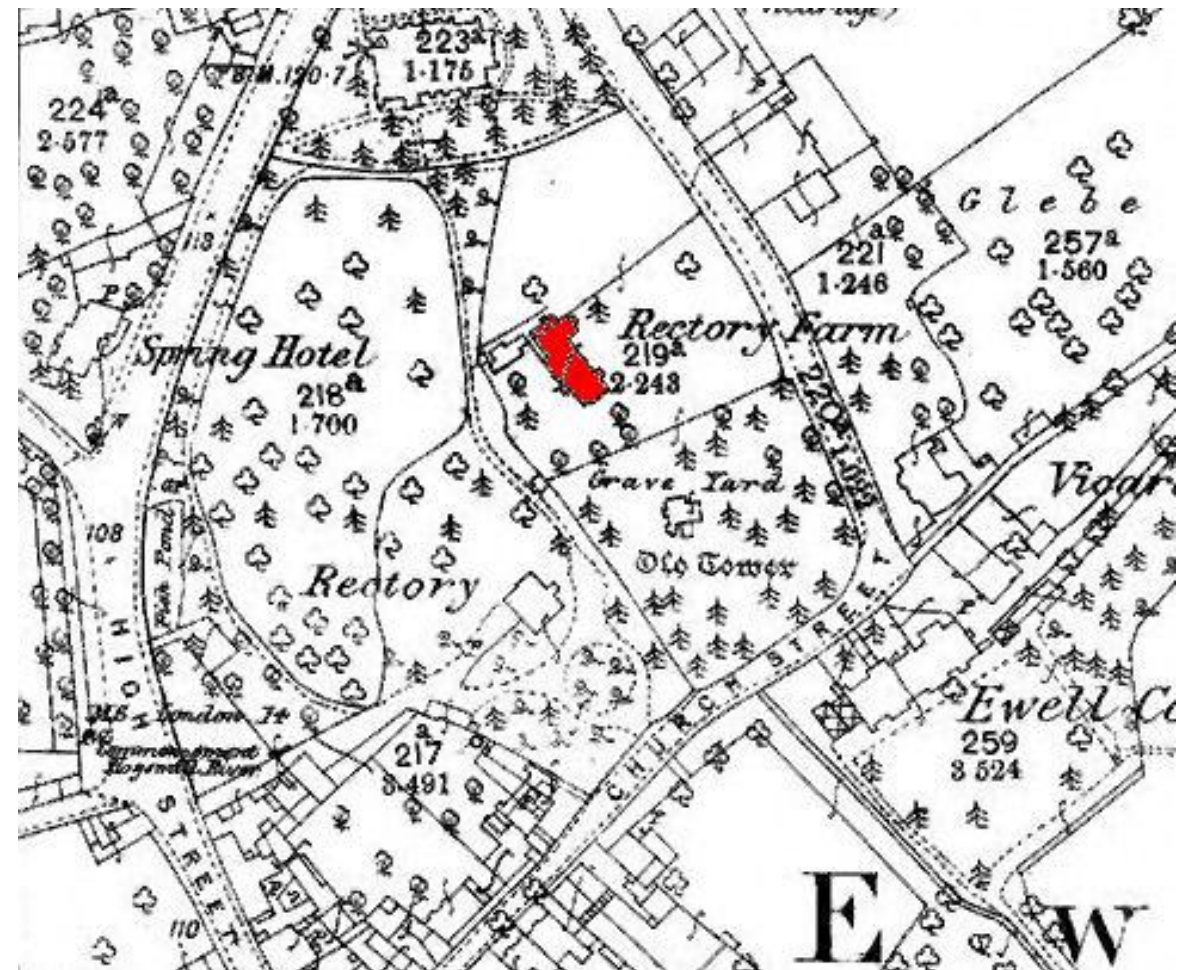

The Lemprière Family

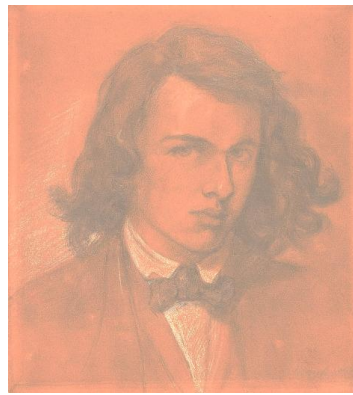
Drawing by John Everett Millais circa 1847 lived in Ewell Manor



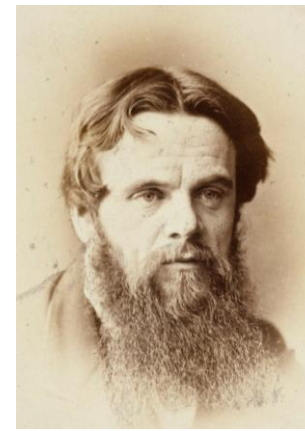

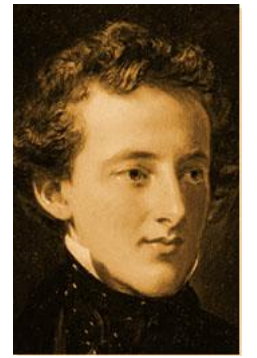

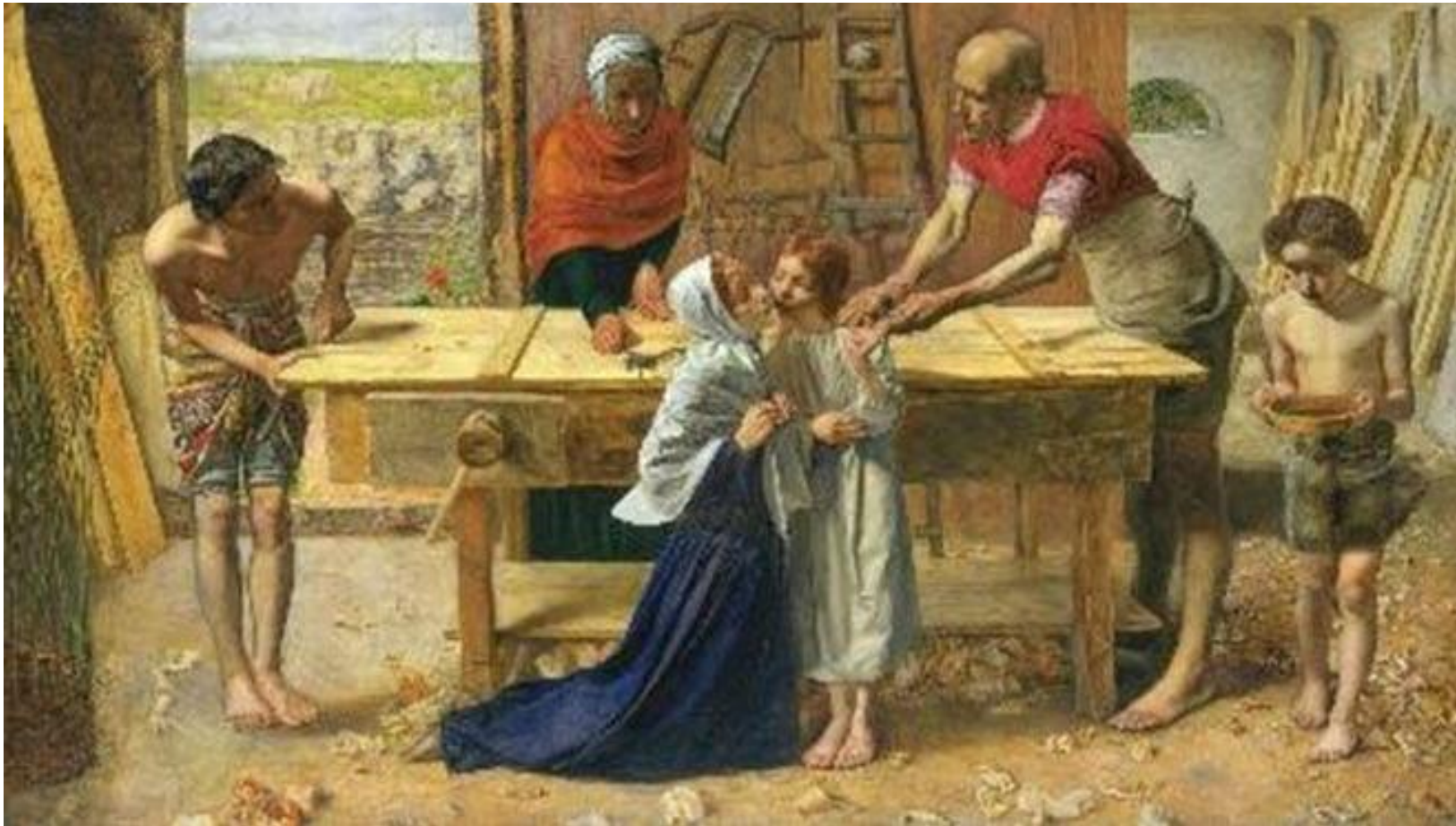

# Painting in Ewell June- November 1851

Holman Hunt and  
Millais came to Ewell to  
stay at Rectory Farm  
with Hunts' uncle.



The pair set off from Ewell along the river Hogs mill  
looking for sites to paint their backgrounds  
Hunt chose the farmland near Ewell Court Farm for  
his work “The Hireling Shepherd”

The location is thought to be on the part of the Hogmill past the old gunpowder mills between modern River Club and Old Malden church.

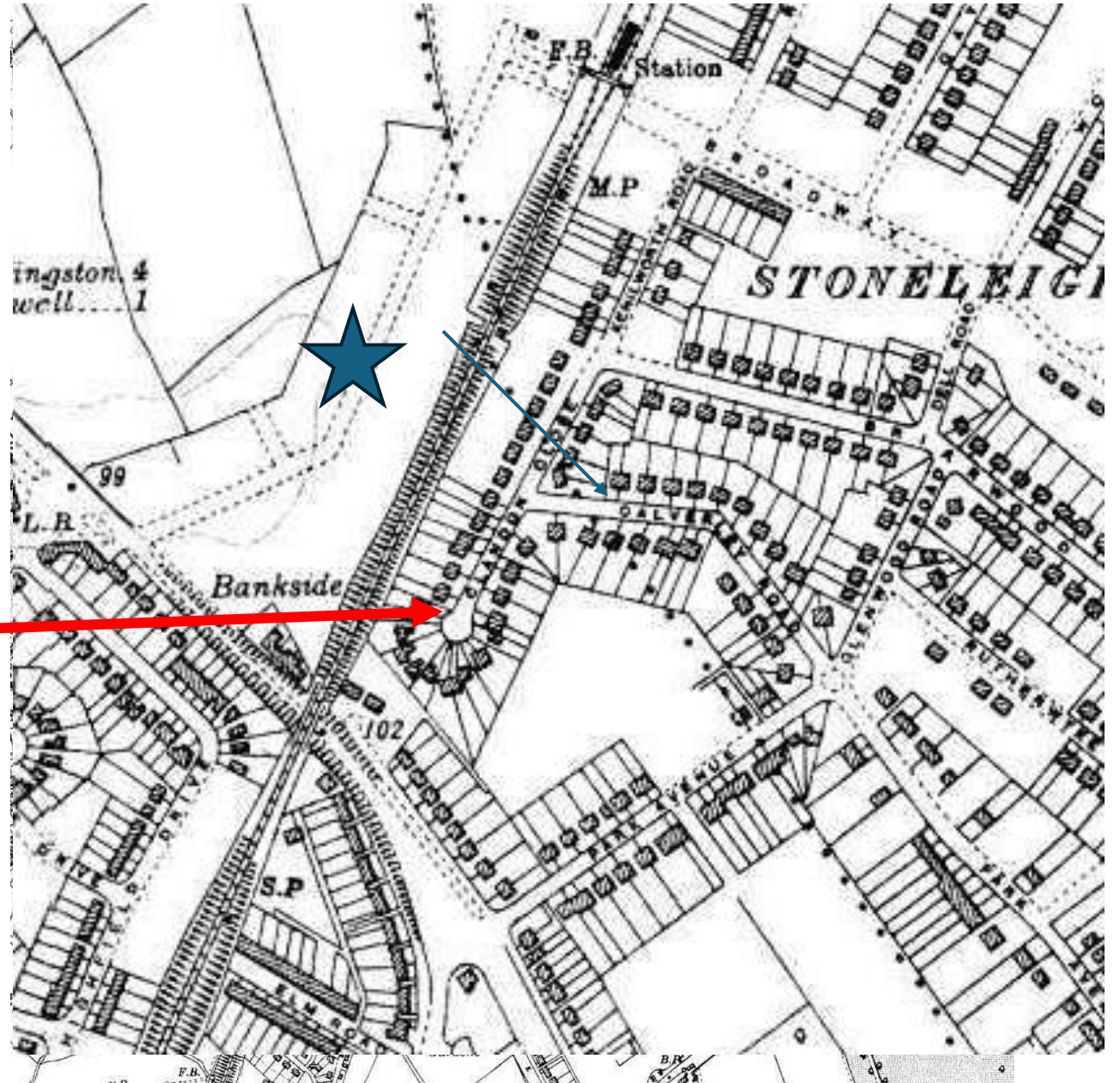

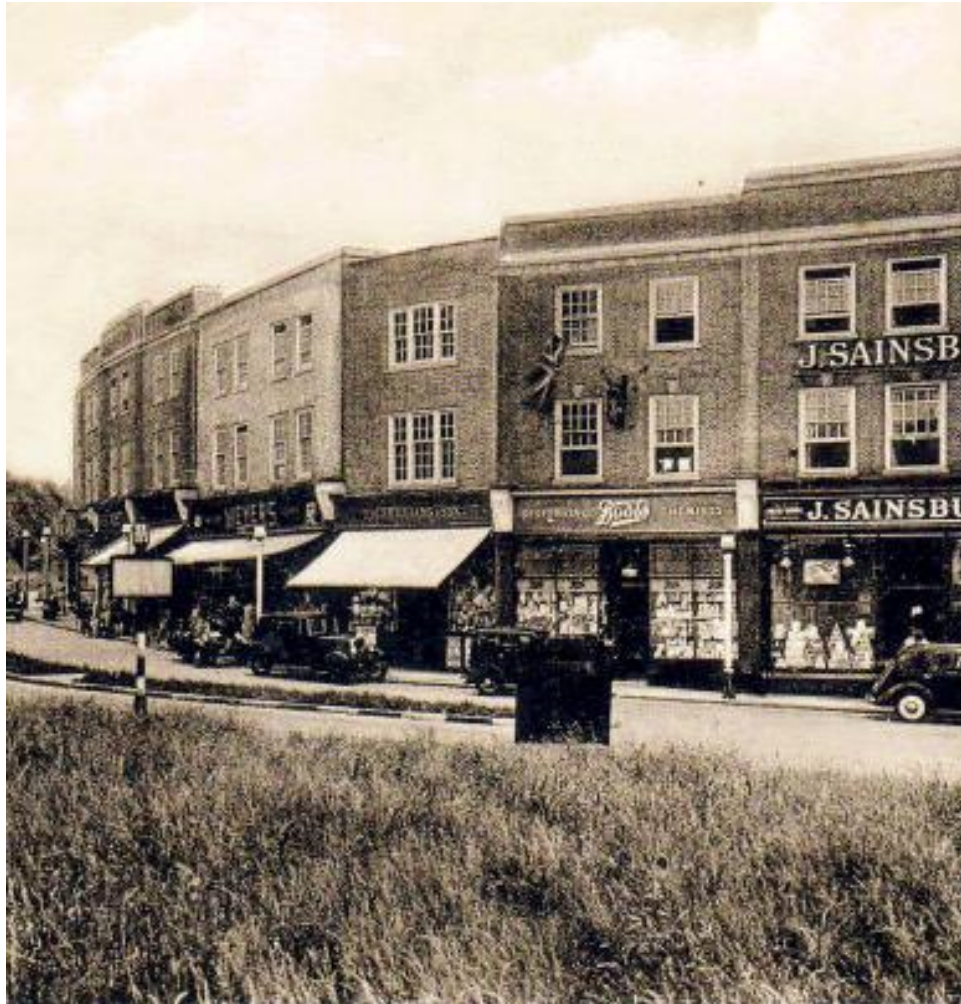

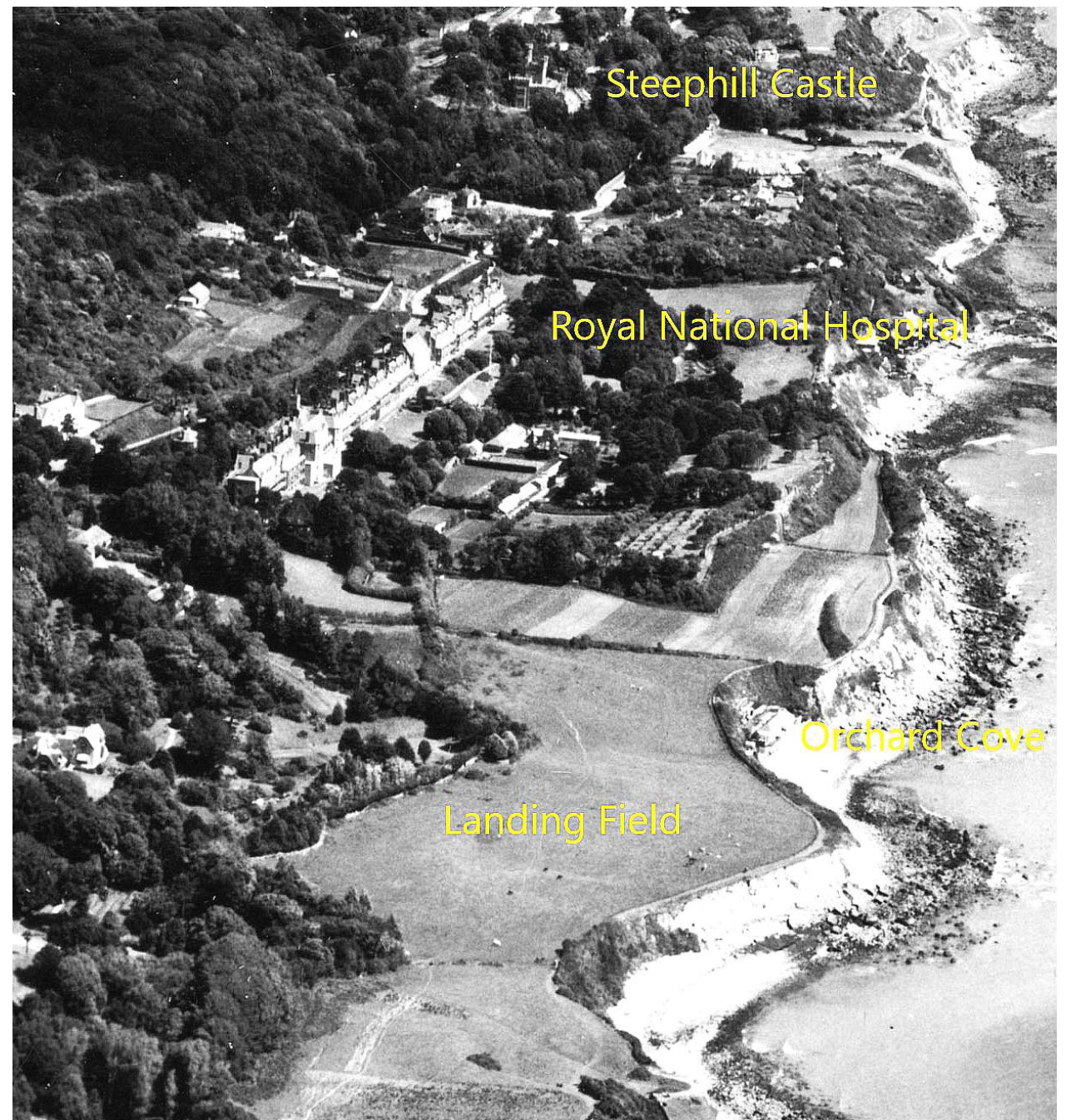
